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Dear Parents and Carers,

I would like to take this opportunity to thank everyone who participated in the recent Parent Satisfaction Surveys. These surveys are an extremely valuable tool for us to obtain feedback from our parents and students; feedback that allows us to better understand what our key stakeholders – you and your children – are feeling about many aspects of the School.

The 2018 survey saw 124 families participate. Whilst this number was slightly down on previous years, it was still a great result.

This year we decided to do something a little different, engaging students from Years 7 to 12 in 'focus group' meetings. The purpose of the focus groups was to provide the students with an opportunity to meet with myself and the leadership at Calvin and expand on the survey data, allowing them the chance to comment, in more detail, about what they liked and didn't like about the School. Of particular interest to me, was gaining an understanding around the reasons the students indicated low satisfaction levels in the survey in some areas we thought we were doing well in.

As it was not possible to include all students in the high school in these focus groups, we invited each year level to nominate one of two of their peers to represent them in the meetings. This seemed to work well, and we ended up with seven student representatives in the Year 7-9 group and six student representatives in the Year 10-12 group.

I was extremely impressed with the way the students conducted themselves in the meetings. Each student brought with him or her an amazing level of insight, a profound respect for their peers, and for many, an astonishing level of maturity for their age.

There were many things the students felt we were doing extremely well at Calvin, however I was more interested in learning what they were not happy about in the School. We asked each group a number of questions ranging from what areas in the School they were concerned about (or that we could improve in) through to questions aimed to ascertain the students' views around characteristics in a class or a teacher that promoted learning.

Our plan from here is for the leadership to re-group early in Term 4 and identify what we can change in the School, both in the short and medium term, to address some of the areas that were highlighted by the students as either concerns or areas we needed to improve in.

I'd like to thank the students who participated in the focus group meetings and to pass on my congratulations on a job well done!



YEAR 4

As part of our studies in Science, Year Four have begun a model boat building unit. We have been studying the properties of natural and processed materials and one of our tasks was to fold origami boats made from a variety of materials (from cellophane to aluminium foil) and test both their 'foldability' and also their buoyancy under pressure. How many marbles could each boat hold, before they leak, or soak, and finally sink? We discovered that there are reasons origami is still made from paper.

This week we introduced the concepts of contact and non-contact forces with our creation of balloon powered boats. Students are beginning to appreciate that some interactions result from phenomena that can't be seen with the naked eye. They have also been set a challenge to make self-propelled boats over the holidays, thinking about thrust and drag. We look forward to testing these boats in a custom made racing pool early next term.

CO-CURRICULAR PUBLIC SPEAKING

Co-curricular Public Speaking

Public speaking co-curricular students have had a fun time entertaining each other with speeches ranging from the hilarious to the very serious. Throughout the term all have spent time considering, learning about and putting into action things like: structuring a speech, engaging the audience, confident demeanors, eyecontact, use of humour, voice projection, research, evidence... and many other public speaking elements. Five of the students, Nathaniel Bradley, Emma Rohrlach, Molly Schmidt, Mackenzie Faulkner and Tessa Shea, decided to pit their skills in the public speaking competition — UN Youth Voice.

The regional round for this competition was held over a weekend early in September, with the finals the following weekend. Students in the junior section (Years 7 & 8) researched, wrote and delivered a speech of four minutes. The topics were related to pitching a solution to a global issue.

Competitors also had an impromptu task. They were each asked two, very probing, questions about their speech and given only two minutes to frame their answers and then two minutes to present. All very challenging!

All five Calvin competitors acquitted themselves most admirably whilst Tessa Shea was selected to progress to the finals. These were held in the atmospheric setting of the Legislative Council at Parliament House, which was a fitting venue for Tessa's excellent speech proposing solutions to access inequities in the justice system. Whilst Tessa didn't place in this year's competition she provided tough competition.

SCIENCE

In Science this term, students have been learning about Plate Tectonics and the theories of Continental Drift. To further extend this knowledge, the Year 9 students and staff from the Science department ventured to Fossil Cove Conservation Area in Blackman's Bay last Thursday.

Fossil Cove is considered an area of national significance as there are thousands of fossils visible in the wave-cut rock. Students spent time categorising fossils and considering how plate movement could have caused the oceanic fossils to move to what we now see as land. Students also observed areas in the rock where magma had been pushed in 'weak spots' to create distinct patterns. Overall, it was an informative and enjoyable time (even though the students had to climb a big hill!).
